- 5. ELIGIBILITY**

The candidate should have passed 12th (10+2) examination from any recognized board with minimum 45% marks (40% for S.C. /S.T. students) in one attempt (No Compartment). Students who have appeared for their H.S.C. finals and

awaiting results are also eligible to apply, subject to submission of passing certificate by the announced date.

Applicants who have obtained 10+2 through Open Universities system directly without having any basic qualification are not eligible for the law programme.

6. **SELECTION PROCEDURE** Symbiosis Law Admission Test (SLAT) followed by Personal Interaction and Writing Ability Test of the short listed candidates. Final selection shall be based on the combined merit list of SLAT score (50%) and PI-WAT (50%)

11. **ASSESSMENT** All internal courses will have 100% component as internal evaluation at the institute level. All external courses will have 40% internal component and 60% external component [University] examination.
- Internal and external heads of passing shall be separate head of passing. Internal evaluation shall consist of one project (20 marks) and minimum 2 of the following (10 marks each): Tutorial, case analysis, cases and open problems, essays, seminar presentations, viva-voce, quiz, drafting, moot court, mock trial, learning logs/diaries, computer based assessment, simulated interviews, objective structured clinical examinations.

12. STANDARD OF PASSING

The assessment of the student for each examination is done, based on relative performance. Maximum Grade Point (GP) is 10 corresponding to O (outstanding). For all courses, a student is required to pass both internal and external examination separately with a minimum Grade Point of 4 corresponding to Grade P. Students securing less than 40% absolute marks in each head of passing will be declared FAIL. The University awards a degree to the student who has achieved a minimum CGPA of 4 out of maximum of 10 CGPA for the programme.

13. AWARD OF DEGREE

Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Laws (Honours) BALLB (Hons) will be awarded at the end of semester X by taking into consideration the performance of all semester examinations after obtaining minimum 4.00 CGPA out of 10 CGPA.

⁶ This course will have three components: a. Moot Court (Three moot courts with 10 marks each= 30 marks); b. Observance of Trial in two cases, one Civil and one Criminal (30 marks); and c. Interviewing techniques and Pre-trial preparations and as per the given format, cumulative Internship diary (60 marks). Each student will further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the Advocate and the procedure for the filing of the suit/petition. This will be recorded in a separate diary. In addition to the above three components, the fourth component will be Viva Voce examination on all the above three aspects (30 marks). Viva voce examination will be conducted by a panel consisting of internal and external members (appointed by the Symbiosis International University).

⁷ Project and presentation course will expect students to research and work towards submitting a mini thesis in the X Semester. The work will be completed under the supervision of a faculty. The student will start working towards this course from 3rd semester onwards based on the specialization he/she wants to work on and depending upon his/her career goals. A faculty guide will be allotted to every student in the 3rd semester and every student will maintain a log book with details of consultation. Student will also align his internship learning and experience with the research towards mini thesis (it can be in the form of case study, white paper, Empirical study. Legislation drafting, action research, applied research etc) and the employer will also sign the log book which will mention the alignment of the internship with the research. Out of the 6 credits 1 credit will be for consultation with the guide/s and follow-up. 2 credits will be for the viva that would be conducted on the mini- thesis that will be submitted and the remaining credits will be reserved for the research on various parameters. No plagiarized paper will be accepted and the word limit for the mini thesis will be 7000 -10000 words.
