

Report on Camping for Constitutional and Administrative Law Students by Prof. Dr. T.R. Subramanya

On 29th April 2024, Symbiosis Law School, Pune, organized an insightful online session titled "Camping: Expert Guidance on LLM Dissertation" for students specializing in Constitutional and Administrative Law. The event was held between 3 pm and 5 pm and attended by over 70 students. The session was conducted by Prof. Dr. T.R. Prof. Dr. Subramanya also highlighted common pitfalls to avoid and shared strategies for dealing with complex legal issues and methodologies.

The session proved to be immensely beneficial for students, equipping them with the necessary tools and strategies for writing a comprehensive and well-structured LLM dissertation. The interactive nature of the session allowed students to engage with Prof. Dr. Subramanya directly, clarifying their doubts and gaining insights into the expectations of academic research in law.
